- Where the Storyteller has taken us:

  Childless Hannah sought God<sup>1Sam1:11</sup>, God blessed her with Samuel
- Hannah prayed<sup>1Sam2:10</sup> and gave Samuel back to God<sup>1Sam2:11</sup> Story shifts to corruption<sup>2:12</sup>> showed need for kingship in Israel
- Samuel was raised up to lead the people<sup>3:20</sup> with God's Word
- Corrupt leaders didn't follow Word<sup>Chp4</sup>
- Chps 5&6 showed us what happens when God's glory is ignored
- God can deliver His people without a king<sup>7:10</sup>; God is all they need! Samuel was faithful in declaring God's Word<sup>7:15-17</sup>

## Samuel Appoints His Sons & People Ask for a King

- Samuel's sons didn't follow; they were corrupt Dt16:18-19
- People ask for a king so they can be like all the nations<sup>8:5</sup>
- Samuel takes offense<sup>8:6</sup>; God says, 'go with what they say!'
- God says, 'they have rejected Me from being king over them'8:7
- Storyteller wants us to see: rejection of God to be like world

### **Note these Contrasts:**

- Israel: God's chosen people<sup>Ex6:7</sup> guided by Word > they want to do what the world does
  They were to be holy<sup>Lev11:45</sup>> they want to be set apart
  Called to be a light<sup>Is42:6</sup>> they want to be like the world

- Israel is rejecting their IDENTITY! What about us<sup>1Pet2:9-10</sup>?
- Church today is called the 'Israel of God<sup>Gal6:16'</sup>...
- We're to be Word guided people. Are we?
- We're to be set-apart, distinct and holy. Are we?
- We're to be light unto the nations? Are we?
- To often we're just like the Israelites of 1 Samuel 8

# Samuel's Warning 10-18

- An earthly king won't GIVE you what you want...
- Samuel's sons TOOK bribes, a king will TAKE your sons 11; TAKE your daughters<sup>13</sup>; TAKE your best<sup>14</sup>; TAKE your servants; and TAKE in taxes<sup>17</sup>.
- The only time a king will GIVE is to his officers<sup>15</sup>, servants<sup>14</sup>, and to himself<sup>16</sup>.
- They will lose the dynamic relationship with God<sup>Ex2:23-25</sup> as their covenant God18

# The Lord Gives Them Over...

- God has rescued His people<sup>Ex19:4-6</sup>, they rejected Him<sup>20</sup>
- They wanted a king to fight<sup>20</sup>; they had God<sup>Ex15:2-3</sup>
- 3x Samuel told<sup>7,9,21</sup> to give them what they want<sup>Rom1:24,26,28</sup>

#### So What?

- Despite people's rejection, God continues to be their God God grants kingship look at God's character<sup>Ex32:11-14</sup>
- God is so merciful and gracious to us Ex34:6-7
- We too have a desire for SELF-RULE...
- God sent Jesus in His great covenant love to be the King we need and to rescue us from our own tyranny of self-rule!
- Jesus TOOK our punishment and GAVÉ Himself for us Mk10:45
